Nurse's Nook¹ by Nurse Deb

The topic for this month's article is **Seizures**. Sources referenced in this article were gathered from the Epilepsy Foundation's website, epilepsy.com, and

Webmd.com.

A seizure is a sudden disruption of the brain's normal electrical activity accompanied by altered consciousness and/or other neurological and behavioral manifestations. There are more than 20 different seizure disorders, and Epilepsy is the most commonly known type.

Epilepsy is a seizure disorder that is characterized by

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unpredictable seizures of varying types. It is a chronic disorder with recurrent unprovoked seizures. A person is diagnosed with Epilepsy if they have had at least 2 or more seizures that were not caused by some known and reversible medical condition such as: alcohol or benzodiazepine withdrawal, low blood sugar, or high fever. Seizures in Epilepsy may be related to a brain injury, or a family tendency, but often the cause remains unknown.

Most seizures are benign, but a seizure that lasts a long time can lead to status epilepticus, a life threatening condition characterized by continuous seizures, sustained loss of consciousness, and respiratory distress. Non-convulsive epilepsy can impair physical coordination, vision, and other senses.

Types of seizures:

Motor attacks, when body parts jerk repeatedly
 Visual seizures; generalized tonic-clonic seizure, where the patient may lose consciousness, muscles become rigid, he/she may fall to the ground, have a bluish tint to skin, bite their tongue, have trouble breathing, and lose bowel or bladder control.

Names of seizures:

• Grand mal seizure lasts between 2-5 mins and the person becomes confused when he/she regains consciousness & may have: trouble talking, complain of head or muscle aches, and have weakness of the extremities.

Primary generalized seizures begin in both halves of the brain at the same time. These seizures are more likely to be major motor attacks.

More likely to be major motor attacks.
 Absence seizures or petit mal generally begin around age 4 and usually stop by the time the child becomes an adult. Absence seizures usually begin with a brief loss of consciousness and last seconds. The patient may become quiet and blink, or stare blankly, roll his eyes, or move his lips. When it ends the person may resume what he was doing and not realize anything happened. If untreated, they can recur as many as 100 times a day, and may progress to grand mal seizures.
 Myoclonic seizures have brief involuntary spasms of

 Myoclonic seizures have brief involuntary spasms of the tongue or muscles of the face, arms or legs. Most myoclonic seizures occur when waking after a

night's sleep.

Akinetic (or atonic) seizures, also called drop attacks, can happen in children. Brief (1-2 second) loss of muscle tone.

 Partial seizures do not spread from the focal area where they arise and patient can remain conscious and later describe it.

• Complex partial seizures may be preceded by: a distinctive smell, taste, or an 'aura'. These may move beyond the focal area and cause loss of consciousness and can become major motor seizures. The patient may not know what is happening and may behave inappropriately and act confused or intoxicated after wards.

When hearing an applicant say they have seizures you will want to ask the following:

When were you Diagnosed?
What type of Seizures do you experience? (There may be more than one).

• Do you experience an "aura" (a warning sign...)

• How many seizures did you experience in the last

year? Month? When was your last seizure?

 Do you still have a driver's license, and do you still drive?

 What type of treatment do you receive for your seizure disorder? Medications?

 Have you ever been hospitalized for a seizure ~ if so when and for how long?

Have you ever had a head injury?
